Our YCC team completed 26 projects and protected over 1,600ft of shoreline within the Cobbossee Watershed this year!

At Nature Day Camp, campers create a relationship with nature through exploration and observation during winter, spring, and summer vacation sessions!

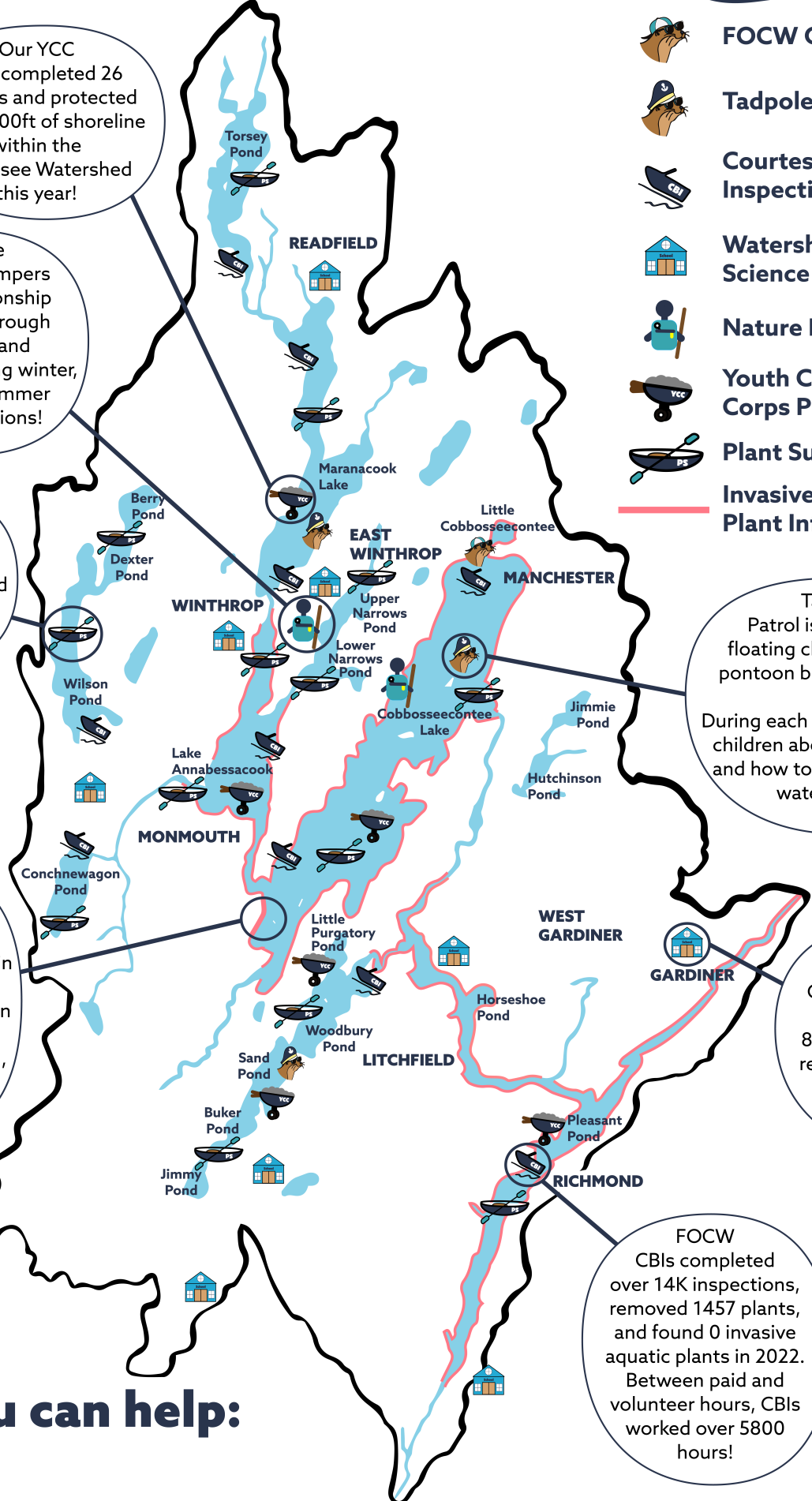
The FOCW Plant Survey team completed 4,000 hours of surveying and covered 200 miles of shoreline 2022!

FOCW manages three different invasive aquatic plants within the Cobbossee Watershed; Eurasian water milfoil, variable-leaf milfoil, and European frog-bit.

Tadpole Patrol is held on our floating classroom, a 22' pontoon boat, the Otter II. During each session, we teach children about lake ecology, and how to test and protect water quality.

FOCW Education Director Cami Wilbert, worked with 39 teachers in 8 different schools and reached 1,018 students during the '21 - '22 school year!

FOCW CBIs completed over 14K inspections, removed 1457 plants, and found 0 invasive aquatic plants in 2022. Between paid and volunteer hours, CBIs worked over 5800 hours!
